Explaining the Jargon

What is a **Programme**?

Graduate Diploma in Construction Project Management (GDCPM)

What is a **Course**?

- Some institutions refer to courses as 'papers'
- The courses make up your programme
- A course has a 4-letter code followed by a 4-letter number e.g. CONS5101 (Technology 1)

PGDCM Programme Overview



PGDCM Pattern of Delivery

CONS6100, CONS7200, other Level 7 courses:

Classes delivered in two 'blocks', each of two full days

Other Level 6 courses:

- Each course runs for eight weeks
- Classes twice a week (4-hour sessions)

PGDCM Study Workload



Full-time study on the **post graduate diploma** programme is like a full-time job



Two compulsory courses and all level 7 courses are delivered in two 2-day blocks (total 32 hrs class time, meaning approximately 118 hrs of individual study <u>per course</u>)

Other Level 6 courses are delivered over seven weeks (half a semester) with two classes per week (total 56 hrs class time, and 94 hrs of individual study <u>per course</u>)
